Training in the aviation industry is being taken to new heights with a one-day course giving managers the chance to plan and take part in a formation flying session.

Run by On-Track (Business Training Associates), the course is designed to foster teamworking and to boost leadership and management skills in managers working from junior levels upwards.

It is held at On-Track Aviation's premises at Wellesbourne Mountford Airfield in South Warwickshire, and uses the formation flying task to teach teamwork and

leadership, planning and prioritising, resource allocation, task management, effective communication, focus and motivation.

Delegates plan the flight and then decamp to dual control light aircraft to take off and manoeuvre in close formation, navigate to the chosen target, identify and photograph it, then return to the airfield for a fighter style break before landing.

On-Track Business Training director Mark Young, who is a commercial pilot and a member of the Chartered Institute of Personal Development, says

that the course brings a new dimension to management training.
